

# Leaflet C: Information following an elective termination

# Information for patients from Women's Health

We apologise if this leaflet reaches you at a bad time, but we feel it is important for you to know exactly how our Trust will handle the remains of your terminated pregnancy.

#### What is an elective termination?

An elective termination is a termination of pregnancy (abortion) for primarily social rather than medical reasons.

# How does the Trust handle products of conception?

On the last Thursday of the month following the termination at 9:30am\* all foetuses and foetal tissues from that month are taken to Thanet Crematorium for a simple ceremony of communal cremation. So if for example, your termination was in June the ceremony would take place on the last Thursday of July. We will need you to sign a consent form for this to take place. Please note, that following the communal cremation, ashes are not returned to parents but are scattered in the Baby and Child area of St John's Cemetery (next to Thanet Crematorium).

The ceremony is completely confidential, and no names are read out aloud or published in any way whatsoever.

Because the crematorium is a public building you have the option to attend if you so wish, although there is no obligation whatsoever for you to do so.

The hospital chaplains and women's health counsellors are available should you wish to talk with them. Their contact telephone numbers are listed on the next page.

\*If this date falls on a bank holiday the ceremony will take place on the last working day before, at the same time and place.
